



Husson softball sweeps UMF in regular season finales; will be on the road for the NAC Tournament

The Husson softball team closed out their regular season with a North Atlantic Conference doubleheader on the road at UMaine-Farmington on Saturday. The Eagles swept the two games and finished unbeaten in the league to claim the top spot in the East Division, as they're going for their seventh straight NAC Championship. In game one- Bulla McCabe had three hits and four RBI, and Tatyanna Biamby (Gorham) added two hits and had two runs driven in as Husson cruised to a 7-0 victory. Sky Johnson (12-3) fired a two-hit complete game shutout in the circle while walking one and striking out nine. In game two- Husson trailed for most of the contest, but came through with three runs in both the sixth and seventh innings to complete the sweep 6-1. Kiara McLeod (Oxford Hills) had the game winning two-run single in the sixth. Julia Gregiore (Massabesic) had three hits for the Eagles, and Ana Lang (Searsport) improved her pitching record to 7-4 by throwing a complete game giving up one run on six hits with no walks and 10 strikeouts. Jojo Daigneault had two hits for UMaine-Farmington, and Melissa Mayo (Lake Region) fell to 3-7 by taking the loss in the circle allowing three runs on four hits with three walks in 5.1 innings. The Beavers end the regular season with a record of 14-16 and 4-4 in the North Atlantic Conference. Husson finishes their regular season with a record of 24-10 and 8-0 in the NAC. Since the start of the 2021 season, the Eagles are now 68-1 in conference games (including playoffs). The Eagles have outscored their league opponents this year 72-4 in their eight games. Next up for Husson is the conference tournament that will be hosted by the top seed from the West SUNY Cobleskill. The full schedule is due to be released either Sunday or Monday when all regular season games have been played.

Husson women's lacrosse stuns Maine Maritime Academy in NAC Championship game; Mariners men oust the Eagles in the semifinals

At Ritchie Field in Castine on Saturday night, the Husson women's lacrosse team scored five goals in the fourth quarter including the game winner late by Averi Baker (Hall-Dale) to stun top seeded Maine Maritime Academy 12-11 in the North Atlantic Conference Championship game. Earlier in the day, the #1 seeded Mariners men ousted the Eagles 28-12 in the league semifinals to advance to the title contest on Sunday. In the women's championship- Baker scored three first half goals to give the guests a surprising 6-2 advantage at the break. Maine Maritime bounced back and outscored Husson 8-1 in the third quarter and were up 11-7 with 14:36 left to play in the game on a goal by Lillian Diversi (Gardiner). The Eagles would then score the next five in a row to shock the host Mariners. After Natalie Whitten (Maranacook) found the net with 11:43 remaining, Maddy Benoit went on her own run of three consecutive goals in a span of 3:31 to even the score 11-11. Husson goaltender Emma Beegz (Lewiston) came up with a big save on Diversi with just under 1:00 left, and she was able to get the possession back for her team. After a timeout by the Eagles, Baker would convert the game winner with 23 seconds showing on the clock. Baker and Benoit had four goals each, with Benoit also adding an assist. Kate Boehmcke added two goals, while Whitten had two goals and an assist. Beegz made 14 saves. Husson is now 8-6 and gets the automatic bid to the NCAA Division III Tournament that begins next Saturday in winning their second conference championship in school history, with the last coming in 2010. Hazel Stoddard (Thornton Academy) led all scorers in the contest with seven points in notching four goals and three assists in the loss for Maine Maritime Academy. Diversi had three goals, and Ella Bowles stopped eight shots in net. The Mariners end a terrific season with a record of 12-2. In the men's semifinals- Maine Maritime built a 16-4 halftime lead and rolled into the title game in the 16 goal victory over Husson. Trey Marcil led the Mariners and all scorers in the game with five goals and six assists. Brendan Reddington also added three goals and six assists, while Tobey

Lappin put in seven goals and had one assist. Andrew Noyes (Falmouth) and Will Farrell (Lincoln Academy) combined to make eight saves in net. The #4 Eagles end their season at 8-8, and were led by Kiernan Field who had an outstanding season as he had four goals and three assists. Field notched 68 goals and 22 assists in his 16 games on the year. Odin Burk made a program record 31 stops in his net. Maine Maritime is now 9-5 and will take on SUNY Delhi in the championship game at Ritchie Field at 3 p.m. on Sunday. The Broncos (11-4) defeated Thomas College 19-6 in the second semifinal on Saturday.

The Central Maine Community College baseball team needed one win on Saturday at the Ballpark in Old Orchard Beach to capture the Yankee Small College Conference Championship, and they took care of that early in the day with a 7-6 victory in 13 innings over Southern Maine Community College. The Mustangs rallied from a 4-0 deficit, eventually ending the marathon of a game on a wild pitch with Brandon Gour scoring from third base in the last of the 13th inning. Tyler Herkalo had three hits and three RBI in the loss for the Seawolves, who needed back to back wins in order to capture the title. SMCC has a record of 23-13, and will await to see if they receive an at large bid to the USCAA Tournament. Zac Gorman had three hits for CMCC (26-13), while Gour had two hits along with two runs scored including the most important run at the end. CMCC gets the automatic bid to the USCAA Small College World Series in Dubois, Pennsylvania which begins next Sunday, May 11th. Bryant walks-off on Maine baseball in 11 innings to clinch series win

Zac Zyons slapped an RBI single to rightfield with two outs in the bottom of the 11th inning on Saturday afternoon, as Bryant knocked off Maine 9-8 in walk-off fashion in America East baseball action on Senior Day for the Bulldogs at Conaty Park in Smithfield, Rhode Island. The win secured a series victory for first place Bryant. The game went back and forth between the top two teams currently in the conference. Maine scored twice in the top of the first inning on an error and an RBI double by Aidan Bardi, before Bryant came right back in the bottom half to grab the advantage 3-2 highlighted by a two-run single by Gavin Greger. The Black Bears didn't hold another lead until the top of the seventh inning. Trailing 6-5, Chris Bear led off with a walk and then with two outs Evan Menzel homered to centerfield to put the guests back on top 7-6. The resilient Bulldogs evened it up on a sacrifice RBI flyout by Drew Wyers in the bottom half. The score stayed the same until Maine pushed ahead 8-7 in the top half of the 11th inning on an RBI double by Brody Rasmussen, and would rely on closer Sebastian Holt to try to end it. For the second straight day though, Brandyn Durand homered off Holt as this time it was a solo shot to leftfield as the leadoff hitter to make it 8-8. Matt D'Amato followed with a looping double down the leftfield line and would advance to third on a wild pitch with no outs. Holt struckout the next two batters swinging, before Zyons singled through the hole between first and second to give Bryant the walk-off win and their seventh straight victory. Menzel, Rasmussen, and Will Burns had two hits each to lead Maine. Menzel knocked in three runs, while Rasmussen had two RBI. Rasmussen and Dean O'Neill also homered. Freshman Caleb Vacchiano (Sacopec Valley) got his first career start versus a conference opponent as he was in the lineup as the DH and had one hit. Caleb Leys started on the mound and saved the bullpen as he got a no-decision allowing seven runs (five earned) on nine hits with three walks and 10 strikeouts in 9.0 innings. Holt (2-2) was charged with his second loss in as many days in relief. D'Amato had three hits to lead Bryant, while Wyers, Greger, and Durand had two a piece. Liam Chamberlain (2-0) earned the pitching win out of the pen. The Bulldogs improve to 25-16-1 and 12-5 in America

East. They've won 14 of their last 15 games overall, suffering just one loss since April 6th. The Black Bears record stands at 19-24 and 12-8 in the conference. The finale of the weekend series is set for a 1 p.m. first pitch on Sunday afternoon.

Brandyn Durand hit a game winning three-run homerun in the bottom of the eighth inning on Friday afternoon, lifting Bryant University to a 5-3 win over Maine in the opener of a three game America East baseball series at Conaty Park in Smithfield, Rhode Island. The Bulldogs were staked to a 2-0 lead into the seventh inning, before the Black Bears rallied to tie it. Aidan Bardi led off with a walk, and Damon Gaither followed with a two-run homer to leftfield to make it 2-2. Maine took their only lead of the day on a two out solo homerun from Bardi in the top of the eighth. The defending league champions from Bryant had the answer in the bottom half of the frame, as Drew Wayers led off with a walk and with one out Gavin Greger doubled to right to put runners on second and third. Sebastian Holt entered the game at that point in relief of starter Colin Fitzgerald, and he was greeted with the game winning three-run homer by Durand that snuck inside the foul pole down the rightfield line.
