



Maine Maritime Academy men's lacrosse plays Wednesday in NCAA Tournament

The Maine Maritime Academy men's lacrosse team will be headed to Nashua, New Hampshire to play in the first round of the NCAA Division III Tournament on Wednesday. The Mariners (10-5) capped off the North Atlantic Conference Championship on Sunday by beating SUNY Delhi 14-12 in the title game in Castine. Their opponent will be the regional host Rivier University. The Raiders are 16-1 and also went 9-0 in the GNAC in the regular season, and won their league championship by topping Lasell 9-7 in the conference final. Rivier is also 10-1 in home games this season and have won 14 games in a row. It is the third appearance in the NCAA Tournament for Maine Maritime Academy, who had previous trips in 2022 and 2023. The game time for Wednesday is set for 4 p.m.

BREWER- The Brewer Witches rallied from a 4-1 deficit, scoring four times in the bottom of the fifth inning on Monday afternoon en route to a 6-4 win over the Bangor Rams in Class A North baseball action at Heddericq Field. Bangor scored three times in the top of the first inning, highlighted by a two-run double to right centerfield by Scottie Sockabasin. He added another RBI double in the fourth to make it 4-1 Rams. Meanwhile, starting pitcher Lucas Rutherford was rolling on the mound only allowing one unearned run on two hits through four innings. Brewer though came alive in the last of the fifth, and knocked Rutherford

out of the game. Jake Perry led off and was hit with a pitch and stole second, scoring on an RBI single by Blake Littlefield who advanced to second on the throw to cut the deficit in half. Chase Swartz came on to pitch for Bangor and was greeted with a groundball RBI single to left by Logan Littlefield. Anderson Clifford then walked, and the Witches tied it on a soft flyball that dropped for an RBI single to right by pinch hitter Thomas Pelkey. Cooper Charette was up next and provided the game winning RBI hit. The hosts added a run in the sixth inning when Perry reached on a dropped third strike, stole second again, and would eventually score on a wild pitch. The Rams got a pair of singles to begin the seventh by pinch hitter Alex Kearns and Kyle Johnson, and had two runners in scoring position with one out but Eli Wall struckout pitch hitters Owen Glanville-True and Matt Turcotte to thwart the threat and end it. Perry was on base three times for Brewer on a walk, hit by pitch, and a dropped third strike. He stole four bases and scored three runs. Logan Littlefield also got on three times with a single, two walks, knocking in one run and also scoring once. Clifford added a single, a walk, and a run scored. Dylan Nadeau doubled and walked. Blake Littlefield got a no-decision on the mound allowing three runs on three hits with five walks and seven strikeouts in 4.0 innings. Wall picked up his teammates in relief and earned the win keeping his opponents off the board with no runs on two hits with no walks and three strikeouts in 3.0 innings. Gavin Glanville-True reached base three times in the defeat for Bangor on a hit by pitch and two walks and also scored two runs. Sockabasin had the two doubles and three RBI before leaving with an injury. Rutherford fired the first 4.0+ innings on the hill and was charged with three runs on three hits with three walks and eight strikeouts. Swartz suffered the loss by giving up two runs on three hits with one walk and one strikeout in 1.0 inning of work. Both teams are now 3-2 on the season and back in action

on Thursday, as Bangor hosts Mt. Ararat and Brewer travels to Brunswick.

Husson baseball wraps up the regular season with doubleheader split; will host NAC Tournament

Husson University and the University of Maine-Farmington split a seven inning North Atlantic Conference baseball doubleheader in the regular season finales at the Winkin Complex in Bangor on Sunday. The Beavers took game one 6-5, before the Eagles salvaged the split with a 12-0 victory in game two. The doubleheader was originally scheduled to be played in Farmington, but was moved to Bangor due to field conditions with UMF still serving as the home team. In game one- UMF was trailing 4-3 in the bottom of the sixth inning before they would score three times on a three-run error and held on for the one run victory. Henry Lausier (Thornton Academy) led Husson with three hits and two RBI, including a solo homerun in the seventh. Akira Warren added two hits and a run driven in. Alex Smith (2-4) started on the mound for the Eagles and took the loss allowing three runs on four hits in 4.0 innings. The Beavers only had four hits, but took advantage of three errors to pull out the win. Lucas Tuttle (4-1) won on the hill in relief. In game two- Husson used a pair of five run innings to roll to the win and pick up a split of the doubleheader. Tanner Evans (Old Town) had two hits and four RBI, while Matt Holmes (Bangor) added a two-run triple. Jackson Curtis (Ellsworth) also contributed two hits and one run driven in. The Eagles used six

different pitchers to combine on a five-hit shutout, only walking one batter. Jack Leno (2-0) fired the first 2.0 innings to get the victory. Chris Albert (Old Town) fell to 1-6 in taking the loss on the mound for UMaine-Farmington, as he was charged with five runs on five hits in 3.2 innings. The Beavers end their season with a record of 10-26 and 4-13 in the North Atlantic Conference. Husson (21-14, 13-4 NAC) clinches the NAC top seed, and will host the league tournament beginning on Thursday at the Winkin Complex in Bangor when they take on #4 SUNY Cobleskill (9-22, 8-4) at noon. Next, Blaze Jordan ripped a go-ahead RBI single that scored Romero and gave the Sea Dogs a 3-2 lead. The Fisher Cats offense sparked again trailing 3-2 in the bottom of the fourth. With one out, Charles McAdoo reached on a walk. Following a flyout, McAdoo (6) stole second base and then advanced to third on a single from Cade Doughty. Dasan Brown followed with an RBI single that scored McAdoo and knotted the game at 3-3. With the game tied at 3-3 in the top of the fifth inning, Blaze Jordan (2) launched a go-ahead solo home run that gave Portland a 4-3 lead. The Sea Dogs added a couple of insurance runs in the seventh inning. After Romero drew a leadoff walk, he was retired via a forceout off the bat of Jhostynxon Garcia, who reached on the play. The next batter Jordan reached base on a throwing error that advanced Garcia to third and allowed Jordan to get to second base. Then Ronald Rosario laced an RBI single that brought home both Garcia and Jordan and gave the Sea Dogs a 6-3 lead. New Hampshire didn't go down without a fight. Trailing by three in the bottom of the seventh, Pinaño was hit by a pitch who then exchanged words, benches cleared

as Pinaño was ejected and replaced by Ryan McCarty. After the kerfuffle, Schreck hit a two-run home run that cut the lead to 6-5. RHP Wyatt Olds (4-1, 2.76 ERA) was awarded the win tossing 3.0 innings allowing two runs on four hits while walking one and striking out six. RHP Devereaux Harrison (1-4, 6.48 ERA) was given the loss pitching 5.2 innings allowing four runs on six hits while walking two and striking out seven. Game 2 The Sea Dogs started the scoring in the bottom of the first inning. Mikey Romero (2) jacked a solo home run which gave Portland an early 1-0 lead. Portland kept the momentum going in the bottom of the second. A two-out single from Caden Rose followed by an RBI double from Karson Simas which scored Rose, increased the Sea Dogs lead to 2-0. Bryant University scored five times in the seventh inning on Sunday afternoon, and swept a three game America East baseball series over Maine with a 9-2 victory at Conaty Park in Smithfield, Rhode Island. The Black Bears trailed 1-0 early, before tying it on a sacrifice fly by Quinn Murphy in the top of the second inning. They took their only lead of the afternoon in the third when Dean O'Neill was caught stealing, but Brody Rasmussen scored on the throw from third base. Brandyn Durand continued his big series with his fifth RBI of the weekend for Bryant with a run scoring single in the bottom half of the third. Drew Wyers gave the hosts the lead for good with an RBI single in the fourth, and extended it to 4-2 with another RBI single in the sixth. The Bulldogs blew it open in the seventh inning to help complete the sweep. Jason Libby (Bangor Christian) came on in relief of starter Gianni Gambardella, and after recording the first out he walked Matt D'Amato and hit Jacob Gaudreau with a pitch. Charlie Saul followed with a no doubt three-run homerun to left centerfield. Jack Donlin then was called on to pitch and was greeted by a double from Zac Zyons and a two-run homer Gavin Noriega to right to make it 9-2 and finish the scoring. Rasmussen, Aidan Bardi, and Chris Bear had two hits each for Maine. Gambardella (5-3) took the loss on the hill allowing four runs on 12 hits with no walks and four strikeouts in 6.0 innings. Wyers and Noriega had three hits and two RBI each for Bryant. Saul added two hits and three runs driven in with his key homerun in the seventh. Jackson Vanesko (4-3) picked up the win out of the bullpen with 4.0 scoreless innings giving up two hits with three walks and a strikeout. The first place Bulldogs have now won eight straight games improving to 26-16-1 and 13-5 in America East. Maine drops to 19-25 and 12-9 in conference play. The top two teams in the league get a bye in round one of the America East Tournament that begins on May 20th and will be held at Mahaney Diamond in Orono. The

Black Bears are currently in second with a .571 win percentage, just a few points ahead of NJIT who is in third (.555 win percentage). Maine finishes up their conference regular season at home next weekend when they take on Binghamton for a three game series, before playing a three game non-conference set at UConn.
