



Husson baseball and softball both heading out on the road for the NCAA Tournament this week

The NCAA announced their regional fields on Monday for the NCAA Division III Baseball and Softball Tournament, Both Husson clubs will be out on the road, fresh off their North Atlantic Conference Championship wins on Sunday. The regionals are all double elimination, with the winners all advancing to the super regionals next week. The Eagles baseball team (24-14), after beating Thomas 17-7 in the NAC Championship for their sixth straight league title, is headed to New Jersey for the regional hosted by Kean University. Husson will square off with the Cougars (35-8) on Friday at 11 a.m. SUNY Cortland (29-11) and Middlebury (27-11) are the other two competitors in the field and will also meet on Friday. Husson is 4-8 in the NCAA Tournament since 2021, and won two games last season to reach the regional final in Willamantic, Connecticut before falling to Endicott College 4-3. Husson softball (27-10) will carry a nine game win streak into the **NCAA** Tournament, defeating host SUNY Cobleskill 8-0 to claim their seventh straight league championship over the weekend. The Eagles are headed to Minnesota in the regional at Saint Mary's of Minnesota, and will take on the host Cardinal (39-3) at 12 p.m. Eastern Time on Thursday. Saint Mary's is on a 29-game win streak and hosting for a first time in program history. Simpson University (31-7) and DePauw University (24-13) are the other two schools in the field and will also square off on Thursday. Husson is 5-12 in the NCAA Tournament since 2018, falling in a regional final in both 2021 and 2024 that they




Maine baseball drops final regular season conference game to Binghamton

The Maine baseball team dropped their final conference game of the regular season on Sunday afternoon at Mahaney Diamond in Orono 6-2 to Binghamton. Brody Rasmussen coming off a four RBI performance in a Black Bears win on Saturday night, had both runs driven in on Sunday with the second one tying it up 2-2 on sacrifice fly in the fifth inning. The Bearcats took over from that point, jumping on top for good in the seventh on an RBI triple by Zach Rogacki. The visitors added three in the top of the ninth on a tworun error and a single for an RBI by Evin Sullivan to end the scoring. Binghamton won the season series over Maine 4-2. Evan Menzel and Dean O'Neill both had two hits in the loss for Maine. Gianni Gambardella (5-4) suffered the defeat on the mound allowing three runs on seven hits with four walks and six strikeouts in 7.0 innings. Rogacki had three hits for Binghamton, while Devan Bade had two. Conner Griffin (2-1) picked up the win in relief on the mound allowing one hit and no runs in 1.2 innings. The Bearcats are now 23-22 and 11-10 in America East. The Black Bears drop to 20-27 and 13-11 in conference play, losing back to back league series to Bryant and now Binghamton after winning five three game sets in a row. Maine wraps up the regular season next Thursday-Saturday with a road trip to take on the University of Connecticut out of the Big East in non-conference action.

Julia Gregiore (Massabesic) had a game winning RBI hit in the first inning, and Ana Lang (Searsport) was dominant in the circle on Sunday afternoon as the top seeded Husson softball team captured their seventh straight North Atlantic Conference Championship with an 8-0 win over host SUNY Cobleskill in six innings in a game played at SUNY Oneonta. The Eagles (27-10) with two outs in the bottom of the first inning and nobody on base got the only run that was needed, Bulla McCabe reached on an error by the centerfielder and advanced to third. Gregiore followed with an RBI single to right. Husson extended their advantage in the third on a McCabe RBI single, and Kiara McLeod smacked a two-run homerun in the fifth to make it 4-0. They would end it in the sixth by mercy rule by tagging on four more, highlighted by an RBI single from Lyndsee Reed (Hermon) and a two-run double to center by Camryn King (Nokomis). Lang got the win going 6.0 innings in the circle and improving to 8-4 on the season. Gregiore and King had two hits a piece in the victory, while McLeod and King drove in two runs each. Husson explodes for 17 runs to win their sixth straight NAC baseball title

BANGOR-Hunter Curtis (Ellsworth) had six RBI including a grandslam, Cam Rendell drove in four runs, and Ryne Rametta added three RBI on Sunday as Husson won their sixth straight North Atlantic Conference Baseball Championship with a 17-7 victory over Thomas College at the Winkin Complex. In a scoreless game in the bottom of the third inning, the Eagles struck first. Rendell worked a leadoff walk, and with one out Matt Holmes (Bangor) looped one down the leftfield line that dropped in for a double. Hunter Curtis followed with a single to left center for a two-run single, and with two outs Rametta doubled to right center to make it 3-0. The Terriers struck back with two outs in the fourth, as Cam Haynes walked and DJ Cagnina (Marshwood) doubled to deep center to score Haynes. Sam Keblinsky (MDI) then slapped a single up the middle to score Cagnina to slice the deficit to 3-2. Husson extended it out to a 7-2 advantage in the bottom of the frame. Keegan Cyr (Bangor) and

Akira Warren (Hall-Dale) both led off with singles, and Rendell laid down a sacrifice bunt to move the runners into scoring position. Jackson Curtis was then intentionally walked to load the bases, and Thomas brought in Brody Walsh (Mt. Blue) to pitch. Hunter Curtis greeted Walsh with a long fly ball to leftfield that with the wind blowing out that way just snuck over the fence for a grandslam. The Eagles really blew it open with five more runs in the sixth inning on a Rametta RBI double, a two-run double by Colin Marshall, and a two-run single by Jackson Curtis to make it 13-2 as they cruised the rest of the way. Hunter Curtis ended up with three hits and his six RBI while also scoring four runs. Rendell had two hits and four RBI, while Rametta contributed four hits and three RBI. Marshall and Jackson Curtis also drove in two runs a piece. Alex Smith (4-2) went 6.0 innings on the mound to pick up the victory allowing three runs on five hits with two walks. Keblinsky led Thomas College in the loss with four hits and two RBI. Hayden Dippner (Mt. Blue), Tony Meza, and Cagnina also added two hits a piece. Justin Conn (2-3) suffered the defeat on the hill giving up three runs on five hits with one walk and four strikeouts in 3.0 innings. The #3 seed Terriers end their season with a record of 20-22. The Eagles are 24-14 and will await location, gametime, opponent for the NCAA Division III Tournament during the selection show on Monday. Husson appeared in the regional final last season before falling to Endicott College. At the end of the NAC Tournament on Sunday, the league announced their All-Tournament Team.
